What are digital workshops ideally like?



“How to facilitate effectively online” is becoming a power skill in today’s hybrid work life. One will explore methods and tools and apply tips and good practices on how to create and facilitate interactive live online settings.

Our working realities and interactions have become to large parts digital. People often come together to discuss, plan, take decisions or share experiences in a variety of workshops or meeting. Unfortunately, digital settings oftentimes appear more tiresome, passive and redundant than presential setting.

BUT...This doesn’t need to be the case...

Virtual formats come with many advantages and can be very engaging and fun – if done well. It is the facilitator’s task to moderate these encounters in an engaging and meaningful manner. A good online meeting design and adequate facilitation quickly allow for a whole new experience for everyone and fruitful results.

This workshop is very hands-on in character. We will explore and apply selective simple but effective tools, methods and techniques while exchanging on how to better plan and design live online formats.

The training will cover important aspects to consider preparing a digital format (set-up, flow, methods) as well as provide tips and tricks for effective communication in a facilitating role in order to enhance a positive online experience for everyone.

Who this Training is for: Participants charged with conceptualization and facilitation of online meetings, workshops, trainings or any other live interactive online setting. You are welcome either as a project leader, team member, trainer or general facilitator.

Training methodology

The training is designed in a very interactive manner discovering the virtual tools, methods and techniques from a facilitator's perspective as we go. Short inputs, small group work, and plenary discussions will allow for space to exchange and apply the learnt. We will use Zoom as our conferencing platform and Mural as our main collaboration space. You will have the chance to apply Real facilitation cases with peers/project teams (day 2/3). Participants will also receive the presentation and outputs as well as further material.

The training is held in English, hence a good command in spoken and written English is required and a good internet connection and basic technical set-up (audio, video, computer, undisturbed and focused spaced) is a prerequisite to allow for a smooth common learning experience.
